Dear members and friends of the European Land and Soil Alliance,

A lot of land - often on greenfield sites - continues to be taken up for industrial estates and logistics areas. Large industrial halls and expansive car parks then usually dominate the picture. Sustainability, soil protection and land-saving goals are still pushed into the background in planning processes. Can we succeed in reducing land consumption and making existing and new commercial areas more sustainable? In the meantime, people at the most diverse levels are dealing with these questions. For example, the Logist.Plus project, in which the European Land and Soil Alliance is also involved, is looking into the question of whether and how the land requirements of the logistics industry can be reconciled with sustainability goals and how land can be used more efficiently.

# **Top Topic: Business and logistics**

**Logist.Plus:** The economically important logistics sector is affected by land use conflicts and rising land prices. So far, it has not been possible to reconcile the land requirements of the logistics sector with sustainability goals. This is where the Logist.Plus project comes in with a land management approach. This approach is intended to enable sustainable long-term development that takes into account the interests of the logistics sector by means of governance structures that span the city, urban hinterland and rural areas, in combination with approaches to cooperative operational environmental and transport management. ELSA is involved as a collaborative partner.

**Land saving offensive - A guide:** The practical guide for investors, companies, municipalities and planners on the topic of "space efficiency in commercial construction" with corresponding best-practice examples is intended to support sustainable and space-efficient commercial developments.

**Sustainable further development of commercial areas:** With the research programme "Experimental Housing and Urban Development" (ExWoSt), the federal government supports

studies, initiatives and model projects for innovative planning and measures on important urban development and housing policy topics. In recent years, one ExWoSt research field was dedicated to the sustainable further development of commercial areas. Results and experiences can be read here.

**Green instead of grey - commercial areas in transition:** Commercial areas do not have to be grey and dreary, but can be valuable components of green cities. The Wissenschaftsladen (WILA) Bonn tested how a sustainable design of existing industrial estates can succeed in a model project with its partners and the cities of Bocholt, Vreden, Iserlohn and Remscheid.

**Develop potential areas for urban nature:** Unused areas such as brownfield sites or building roofs and facades are well suited to increase the share of urban nature. However, such transformations are often associated with challenges. The City of Chemnitz, European Capital of Culture 2025, together with Climate Alliance and Ecologic Institute, invites you to a two-day international conference on 11 and 12 May 2023 to jointly find solutions on how to accelerate the green transformation by developing underused spaces in cities.

## More messages

**Back to earth:** Call for proposals under the EU HORIZON programme. Funding is available for the establishment of a network of relevant actors and projects that serve to strengthen social awareness of the importance and challenges of soil. The submission of project proposals is possible until 23.9.2023.

**Regionalwert AGs:** Citizens' shareholding companies that invest in regional organic agriculture and food production and that aim to significantly increase food sovereignty in the respective region.

**National Water Strategy:** On 15 March 2023, the German Federal Cabinet adopted the National Water Strategy to respond to the multiple challenges posed by climate change.

**Land consumption in Germany:** The settlement and transport area in Germany grew by an average of 55 hectares per day over the four-year period from 2018 to 2021. The goal of the Federal Government in the German Sustainability Strategy is to limit the average daily increase to less than 30 hectares by 2030. The aim is to achieve a circular land economy by 2050. This means that no further net land should then be developed for settlement and transport purposes.

**Twelve reforms for effective soil protection:** The nature conservation organisation WWF, with the support of Daniel Ennöckl, Professor of Public Law at the University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences (BOKU), has developed a catalogue of twelve legal instruments that should contribute to more effective soil protection in Austria. The analysis recommends a stronger anchoring of soil protection in the legal system, among other things through a binding cap.

Land consumption - state liability suit against Austria planned: The initiative AllRise - Verein zur Förderung des Umweltschutzes, der Demokratie und der Rechtsstaatlichkeit (Association for the Promotion of Environmental Protection, Democracy and the Rule of Law) is planning to file a state liability suit against the Republic of Austria at the Constitutional Court because of the high land consumption. The lawsuit is to be accompanied by a catalogue of proposed solutions to reduce land consumption. The initiative is still looking for supporters.

**Peatland Atlas 2023: Climate protectors in danger:** Intact peatlands protect the climate. They store enormous amounts of carbon in their peat. However, this only works when they are wet. The Moor Atlas 2023 shows that more than ten percent of the world's 500 million hectares of peatlands have already been drained. In Central Europe, the figure is well over 90 percent. The atlas is a cooperation project of BUND with the Heinrich Böll Foundation and the Michael Succow Foundation, partners in the Greifswald Moor Centrum.
